



4 Ways to support Poll Workers

For businesses that cannot provide paid time off, there are other ways to express support poll workers:

Provide Volunteer Information

Signal Your Support for Poll Workers

Post signage encouraging customers and other visitors to consider serving as poll workers in local elections.

Feed your local Poll Workers

Poll workers often work a 14 - 16 hour day. Contact your local election officials to find out how to donate breakfast, lunch or dinner for poll workers.

Be Creative

Think about other ways you or your business can support or encourage poll workers. Even if it's just stopping by a polling place and thanking them for the role they play in supporting our democracy.
